#### Dear Colleagues

On behalf of the Board of IFBLS I should like to thank each of you, and each of your members, for their continued commitment to save lives during this Covid-19 pandemic.

At our World Congress held in October in Suwon, South Korea, the main speaker at the plenary session was Dr. Maria Van Kerkhove from the World Health Organization. She acknowledged our profession and the critical role we have played, and will still play, as this pandemic evolves, the virus mutates, and we all grapple with 'long covid'.

The impact of this virus has been enormous with global infection of >650 million cases resulting in >6.5 million deaths. The ability of this virus to evolve coupled with inconsistent use of proven public health measures drove high transmission while low vaccination coverage and lack of access to diagnostics and therapeutics led to significant impact. The importance of sequencing detected cases was stressed as a key measure to track the evolution of this pandemic. In conclusion Dr. Van Kerkhove stated that this pandemic is not over, millions are being reinfected weekly with billions awaiting vaccination. Despite this many countries are dismantling systems and the specialised workforce. Each of us must continue bring our influence to bear on healthcare policy.

Recent data from *Our World in Data* confirms that, in spite of excellent vaccines, the daily case numbers remain significant. Added to that the range of variants being detected in different regions is changing rapidly.

Following this assault on immune systems there are now increasing cases of other respiratory viruses and bacterial infections leading to hospitalisation, and indeed death, of children. Once again, our expertise will be needed to diagnose these illnesses and to monitor the sequelae of severe infection.

As the year draws to a close, and 2023 beckons, I wish you all a very Happy Christmas, may it bring you peace and joy.
